The undersigned certifies and swears that there is probable cause to believe the above-named defendant, on the 28th day of July, 2026, at approximately 20:00 hours at [REDACTED], violated the law and did then and there:

Narrative Title: Narrative

On July 29, 2026, at approximately 2241 hours, Officer Loveless responded to 124 North Florida Avenue (Athens Theatre) in reference to a report from a woman who stated she had found two deceased bodies behind the theater building.

Upon arrival, Ofc. Loveless observed multiple vehicles parked in the parking lot, with several individuals standing outside their vehicles. Ofc. Loveless was the first officer to arrive on scene. After exiting his patrol vehicle, he observed that all individuals on scene appeared to be in varying states of panic and distress. A woman later identified as being Bailey Hester, advised that her step-son was deceased. She and the other individuals pointed toward a large box trailer parked behind the theater building, stating that the body was located there.

Ofc. Loveless instructed all individuals to remain in the parking lot before approaching the trailer. As he approached, Ofc. Loveless observed the arm and hand of a deceased individual lying in a dried pool of what appeared to be blood. The deceased male was wearing a black t-shirt, blue jeans, brown combat boot. The deceased male had a multicolored tattoo and the initials of "DR" on his upper left arms. Ofc. Loveless continued around the rear of the trailer, where he observed the deceased body of a white male wearing a green in color sweatshirt, blue jeans, and brown boots who appeared to be either an older teenager or in his early twenties. Ofc. Loveless observed that the body appeared to be in rigor mortis and that a large amount of blood was present around the male's mouth, the back of his head, and pooled beneath his head and back. The body was lying on its back with the head facing east and the feet facing west. Ofc. Loveless also observed a black handgun on the ground beneath the male's right hand and noted that the male was wearing a concealed carry holster on the front of his waistband.

Ofc. Loveless notified dispatch that he had located one individual who was clearly deceased. He then observed a second body a few feet west of the first victim. Ofc. Loveless observed that the second body was also that of a white male. Based on his initial observations, he believed the second male to be in his thirties or forties and significantly heavier than the first male. The second male was also lying on his back, with his feet pointing east and his head pointing west. Ofc. Loveless observed what appeared to be a severe injury to the male's forehead/head area, which had bled extensively and pooled beneath his head. He also observed significant lividity in the male's arms and face where they were in contact with the ground. Ofc. Loveless advised dispatch that he had located a second individual who was clearly deceased.

Ofc. Loveless did not identify or interview any of the individuals on scene. He maintained security of the crime scene and the deceased until members of the Criminal Investigations Division (CID), Crime Scene Technicians (CST), and the Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office arrived to process the scene, collect evidence, and assist with the investigation. Ofc. Loveless located a spent shell casing, which was marked by CID and later photographed and collected by CST.

On 07/28/2026 at approximately 2300 hrs, Detective Welch was notified of an incident at 213 W New York Ave in reference to the discovery of two deceased individuals, and subsequently responded.

Det. Welch observed two white male subjects, approximately 18-19 years of age, laying supine on the concrete deceased. The first male, later identified as being Sampson Campbell via fingerprint scanner, was positioned with his head pointed to the west, and feet to the east, with his head closest to the back end of the semi-trailer near the wheels. Campbell was wearing tan military-style laced boots, blue jean pants, a dark color web belt with a metal-type sliding military buckle, a light-green camouflage sweatshirt and a dark in color hat laying just above his head. Campbell's eyes were opened and appeared hazy, and there was blood pooled around his head/neck area. Det. Welch observed a left-handed concealed carry firearm holster in the front waistband of Campbell's pants. Campbell's left arm was extended horizontally, and his right was bent, with his hand curled in. A black in color semi-automatic firearm was found resting upright in the crook of his arm, with the muzzle oriented parallel to his body. The firearm was later recovered via the Deland Police Department crime scene unit and submitted to evidence. The firearm was identified as a Ceska Zbrojovka (CZ), CZ P-10 C 9mm semi-automatic handgun (S/N F369793). There was no round in the chamber of the firearm, and a 15-round capacity standard magazine was inserted. Once removed, the magazine was found to have 14 rounds of various 9mm ammunition. Several small, circular wounds were observed throughout Campbell's body. The only observable wounds prior to the medical examiner arriving on scene was a small, circular wound to his left cheek, and a wound slightly larger than the one observed in his cheek near the upper right portion of his neck, near the top of the trap muscle.

Det. Welch observed the second male, identified as Dustin "DJ" Rose, laying with his feet positioned with the soles of his feet facing Campbell's, with approximately 1-3 feet separation. Rose's head was positioned closer to the fence line bordering property under construction. Rose was wearing tan colored military-style laced boots, blue jean pants with a dark web-belt and metal-type sliding military buckle, and a black in color tee shirt with an upper left chest pocket. Det. Welch noted that he had sustained a penetrating injury to his left eye, that appeared to cause a complete loss of the eyeball. This injury is consistent with damage caused by a projectile from a firearm. A second wound was later discovered to Rose's upper right trap (trapezius) muscle. The wound was a small, circular wound, more identifiable as being a gunshot wound. Rose's arms were outstretched, and in his right hand was a small, black canister of self-defense pepper spray. A tan in color cloth strap was slung across his right shoulder, draped diagonally downward and around his lower left side and back upward, connected to a zippered pouch, which was laying directly under him, approximately mid-back. A tan in color hat was found 1-3 feet away just to the left of him.

The Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office arrived on scene. A wallet was located in the pocket of the male wearing a green sweatshirt and blue jeans. Identification inside the wallet identified the male as Samson Campbell. Identification was also located in the pants pocket of the male wearing a black shirt and blue jeans, identifying him as Dustin Rose.

A total of five (5) spent shell casings were located within the crime scene.

As DeLand Crime Scene Technicians and the Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office continued processing the scene, a red iPhone was located on Campbell's person. Additionally, a dark blue iPhone with a black case was located in Rose's pocket. The Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office and DeLand Police Crime Scene Technicians confirmed that both Campbell and Rose had sustained multiple gunshot wounds to various parts of their bodies, including a contact gunshot wound to Campbell's neck.

Also located within the scene was a single grey in color Croc shoe. The shoe appeared to be clean and not heavily worn. The Croc did not appear to have been in the area for a long period of time and seemed to be out of place from the remainder of the scene.

Near the victims was a clear plastic bag containing a green leafy substance. The items were later tested by Det. Bota which were presumptive positive for cannabis, weighing approximately 3.4 grams.

On 07/30/2026, Volusia County Medical Examiner Dr. Fulcher confirmed that the manner of death for both Rose and Campbell was homicide.

On 07/31/2026, the shell casings recovered from the scene were provided to the Volusia County Sheriff's Office for NIBIN analysis. At approximately 1500 hours, the analysis report was returned and advised that the firearm recovered with Samson Campbell was not the one that fired the expended shell casings.

On 07/30/2026, and 07/31/2026, detectives with the DeLand Police Department conducted an extensive canvass of the area surrounding the crime scene in an effort to identify and obtain available surveillance footage. As a result of that canvass, detectives collected and reviewed video recordings from multiple surveillance systems documenting the movements of the victims and other individuals in the area prior to the homicide.

Surveillance footage from 07/28/2026, at approximately 1900 hours captured Samson and Dustin within Chess Park, located at 114 W. Indiana Avenue, DeLand, Florida. While reviewing the footage, detectives observed Samson speaking on a cellular telephone while pacing throughout the park. Samson's demeanor appeared anxious or uneasy based upon his repeated pacing and movements. After several minutes, Samson removed the phone from his ear and began walking with Dustin north through the park toward West Indiana Avenue. Both individuals exited the camera's field of view at approximately 1907 hours.

At approximately 1908 hours, a separate surveillance camera located near the intersection of West Indiana Avenue and South Florida Avenue captured Samson and Dustin walking westbound on West Indiana Avenue. The two continued west, crossed South Florida Avenue, and proceeded in the direction of the secluded area behind the Athens Theatre out of frame, this is the location where their bodies were later discovered.

On 7/28/2026 at 1908 hours, a Hispanic or light-skinned black male (S1) wearing a white T-shirt, peach/salmon in color shorts, and a white helmet, was captured on surveillance from 514 W Rich Avenue riding a black E-bike eastbound on Rich Avenue.

At 1909 hours, S1 was observed riding eastbound past the Volusia County School Board, located at 200 N. Clara Avenue.

At approximately 1911 hours, surveillance footage from a camera facing west which captures the north side of the Athens Theatre recorded S1 riding an electric bicycle through a parking lot to the north of the Athens Theatre. This parking lot is immediately adjacent to the Athens Theatre. S1 was wearing a light-colored shirt and peach/salmon-colored shorts, and white helmet. Surveillance footage showed that S1 stopped at the northwest corner of the Athens Theatre, and remained stationary for 7-8 seconds, during this time the individual appeared to be manipulating his front waistband. This S1 then traveled into the secluded area behind the Athens Theatre where the deceased bodies of Samson and Dustin were later found. S1 remained out of view for approximately three minutes before reappearing on the surveillance footage and departing the area on the electric bicycle traveling north towards Rich Avenue.

Detectives also obtained Ring camera footage from the Athens Theatre, this camera faces east toward South Florida Avenue and records both video and audio. While reviewing the video and audio captured by this camera, Detectives noted the sound of eight gunshots. Six of

the gunshots were heard at approximately 1913 hours, followed by two additional gunshots approximately eight seconds later.

A further review of all available surveillance footage revealed no other individuals entering or exiting the secluded area behind the Athens Theatre during this relevant time period. Specifically, no persons other than Samson, Dustin, and S1 on the electric bicycle were observed entering the area before the gunshots were heard. No additional individuals were observed leaving the area before or after the unidentified individual departed on the electric bicycle.

While reviewing video footage available to law enforcement, a surveillance camera captured S1 on the electric bicycle traveling north across the parking lot adjacent to the Athens Theatre to Rich Avenue. The subject is also captured traveling West on Rich Avenue then turning North on San Souci Avenue.

While reviewing video footage available to law enforcement, a surveillance camera captured S1 on the electric bicycle traveling north on Clara Avenue from Wisconsin Avenue at 1914 hours. This was captured on surveillance video from St. Barnabas School, located at 322 W. Michigan Avenue.

At 1916 hours, S1 was observed riding westbound from the intersection of Minnesota Avenue and Clara Avenue. This was captured on surveillance video from the residence located at 310 W. Minnesota Avenue. Specifically, S1 was observed wiping his face multiple times with his T-shirt and spitting. Based on Det. Welch's training and experience, to include having been personally exposed to OC Spray, it is common for an individual who has been exposed to a chemical agent such as OC spray to wipe their face and spit in attempt to reduce irritation caused by the chemical agent. Det. Welch knows OC spray can cause extreme eye irritation and nasal discharge and oral hypersalivation/irritation.

Also at 1916 hours, S1 was observed riding westbound past the Stetson Cove Apartments, located at 315 W. Pennsylvania Avenue.

At 1921 hours, S1 was observed riding westbound from the Circle K, located at 1098 International Speedway Boulevard. S1 was observed crossing State Road 15A and International Speedway Boulevard before continuing west into the Glenwood Springs subdivision. While reviewing available surveillance footage, the individual on the electric bicycle was seen failing to stop at several stop signs during his travel from the area of the Athens Theatre.

On July 31, 2026, Detective Bota made contact with Karen "Kathy" Chobin, who identified herself as the aunt of Samson. Kathy advised that she wished to provide information she believed would assist law enforcement in the ongoing investigation.

Kathy stated that she accessed her online T-Mobile account and reviewed the call history associated with Samson's red Apple iPhone, telephone number (386) 429-9156. Kathy advised that, after she had not heard from Samson on 07/28/2026, she reviewed his call activity and observed several outgoing and incoming communications. She identified the last five telephone numbers associated with Samson's call history prior to the decedents being located. Kathy provided the following five numbers:

- (407) 666-4393 – Identified by Kathy as belonging to Samson's friend, Tavis.
- (386) 880-6010 – Unknown to Kathy.
- (386) 956-3204 – Identified by Kathy as belonging to Vertis Samson.
- (386) 801-0540 – Identified by Kathy as belonging to the grandparents of the other decedent.
- [REDACTED] Unknown to Kathy.

Detectives subsequently utilized law enforcement databases and other investigative resources to identify the two previously unknown telephone numbers. Telephone number (386) 880-6010 was determined to be associated with Antonio Chambers, and telephone number [REDACTED] was determined to be associated with [REDACTED].

Detectives then conducted investigative database inquiries regarding [REDACTED] and obtained a known photograph of him. After reviewing and comparing [REDACTED] known appearance with the surveillance footage, Detectives determined that [REDACTED] physical appearance was consistent with the physical appearance of the unidentified individual captured on video. Specifically, [REDACTED] possesses the same general complexion, body build, and stature as the subject observed in the surveillance footage.

A subpoena was submitted to AT&T for [REDACTED] phone number [REDACTED] to compare to with the last known numbers provided by Kathy. Detectives received a response from AT&T with phone number [REDACTED] detailed call list. While reviewing the call logs it revealed that [REDACTED] had contact with Samson's phone number (386) 429-9156 on 07/28/2026 at 6:44pm. Det. Welch knows [REDACTED] residence located at [REDACTED] located approximately 3.2 miles (road distance) from the crime scene.

Additionally, a review of [REDACTED] Florida Driver and Vehicle Information Database (DAVID) record revealed his listed residential address is [REDACTED]. Detectives recognized this address as being located within the Glenwood Springs subdivision. This location is significant because surveillance footage previously obtained during the investigation depicts S1 riding the electric bicycle from the area of the Athens Theatre and traveling to and entering the Glenwood Springs subdivision as captured on surveillance cameras in the vicinity of 1098 W. International Speedway Boulevard, DeLand, Florida 32720 (Circle K). Based upon the surveillance footage, the subject was observed traveling into the same subdivision in which [REDACTED] resides. This footage further corroborates that [REDACTED] is the subject in question, who was observed traveling on the electric bicycle from the area of the Athens Theatre immediately following the sounds of 8 gunshots.

Detectives made contact with a confidential source of information who resides in the immediate area of [REDACTED] residence, hereinafter referred to as CS #1. CS #1 was shown a photograph of the individual riding the electric bicycle from the area of the Athens Theatre. CS #1 advised he/she has frequently seen a male matching [REDACTED] description riding an electric bicycle that appears to match the description of the bicycle captured on the surveillance footage. On 08/01/2026, Det. Welch generated a photographic lineup consisting of six (6) photographs on individuals with similar physical characteristics including within the lineup was a photo of [REDACTED]. Det. Welch provided this lineup to Sergeant Floryance in a manilla folder with the lineup inside. The lineup was provided to Ofc. Evans, who met with CS #1. Ofc. Evans administered the lineup to CS #1, upon viewing the lineup CS #1 identified the photograph of [REDACTED] as the subject he/she frequently observes riding on the electric bicycle. CS #1 also identified [REDACTED] as the subject who is known to him/her to reside [REDACTED].

On 05/10/2026, [REDACTED] was contacted by law enforcement during the course of traffic collision investigation, during this investigation [REDACTED] provided his cellular telephone number as [REDACTED], to law enforcement on body worn camera, he additionally confirmed his home address as [REDACTED].

Based upon the totality of the circumstances surrounding this investigation including the following:

- [REDACTED] communication with the decedent less than 30 minutes prior to murder of Samson and Dustin.
- [REDACTED] physical resemblance matches the physical appearance of the individual depicted in the surveillance footage traveling on the electric bicycle from the area of the crime scene.
- Surveillance footage showing the individual on the electric bicycle traveling into the subdivision where [REDACTED] resides following the murder of Samson and Dustin.
- The fact that a gray in color Croc shoe was located with the deceased bodies of Samson and Dustin, and the fact that CS #1 provided law enforcement with a photograph of [REDACTED] riding the electric bicycle while wearing what appears to be gray in color

Croc shoes, captured on July 6, 2026.

- The fact that OC spray was located in the hand of Dustin's deceased body, and the subject observed on surveillance footage riding the electric bicycle from the area of the Athens Theatre appeared to be suffering from the effects of being exposed to OC spray.
- Det. Welch knows it would take approximately 17 minutes to traverse 3.2 miles (the approximate distance from [REDACTED] residence to the area of the crime scene) on an electric bicycle.
- Based upon the time of the recorded telephone communication between [REDACTED] and Samson and the time it would take [REDACTED] to travel to the Athens Theatre on his electric bicycle, this further corroborates [REDACTED] is the subject captured on surveillance footage in the area of the Athens Theatre at the time of the recorded eight (8) gunshots.
- The male on the electric bicycle was observed on surveillance footage in the area of the Athens Theatre manipulating his front waistband just prior to the recorded shots fired. Det. Welch knows subjects frequently conceal firearms within their front waistbands and they frequently adjust the firearm specifically to ensure the firearm is able to be quickly retrieved from their waistband.

Late on 8/1/2026, a search warrant was signed by the Honorable Joseph LeDonne and subsequently executed at the residence located at [REDACTED]

No residents were located inside the home.

As the SWAT team was conducting their search of the residence, the homeowner and grandmother of the suspect, [REDACTED] arrived on scene via a ride-hailing service (Lyft, Uber, etc) [REDACTED] had multiple suitcases with her, and advised she had just returned from a trip to Ft. Lauderdale. Det. Bota made contact with [REDACTED], who asked why law enforcement were present at her residence. Det. Bota explained to [REDACTED] that the residence had been secured pending the execution of a search warrant.

[REDACTED] stated that she was the primary resident and, when asked if anyone else lived there, replied, "Sometimes." When asked to clarify, explained that her grandson, [REDACTED] occasionally stayed at the residence but did not permanently reside there.

Det. Bota asked [REDACTED] when she had last seen [REDACTED] at the residence. [REDACTED] responded, "I don't know," and further stated that "he comes and goes and stays in one of the rooms at times." Det. Bota then asked whether [REDACTED] maintained a bedroom within the residence. [REDACTED] replied, "He don't live here, just comes and goes."

On the northeast side of the residence, above the attached garage, detectives observed a video surveillance camera affixed to the exterior of the residence that appeared to be hardwired.

Inside the garage was a black in color E-bike which is consistent with the E-bike the suspect was observed riding to and from the scene of the homicide.

As detectives entered the residence, detectives observed multiple surveillance cameras affixed to the ceiling in various areas around the residence, as well as the back yard.

The residence is a three-bedroom single-story residence. From the entryway of the front door, to the left is a standard bathroom, with a single bedroom flanking the left and right of the hallway. The southeast room (left of the bathroom) appears to be a general guest bedroom, and had the bed made and was tidy. The room to the right appears to be the room of a male, with a small reptile enclosure containing a small python. Male clothing was hanging in the closet, as well as male tennis and basketball shoes. The bed was not made and appeared slept in. A small waste basket had trash in it to include paper plates and a partially eaten corn dog.

South of the living room is the master bedroom. This room appears to be primarily used by [REDACTED], though she had confirmed she was out of the area the past several days. Inside the bedroom, and set parallel against the same wall as the entry door to the room is a dresser with a television set atop. Next to the dresser is a small table with a monitor showing multiple camera angles both interior and exterior of the residence, including view from the northwest side of the residence, which captured the porch area and backyard facing south. Det. Welch observed the letters UNV embedded on the video layout displayed on live video feed. Det. Welch observed other detectives moving throughout the home indicating it was in fact working. Inside a walk-in closet inside the bedroom detectives located a UNV DVR affixed to the wall via two screws, with multiple cords plugged in. During the remaining search of the linen closet inside the master bathroom area, was a black Smith & Wesson 9mm M&P Shield handgun (S/N JDB7554). The firearm was seated in a small leather waist conceal carry holster, and was concealed in a purse, which was wrapped in a plastic bag and concealed underneath towels and other misc. bathroom items in the closet. The firearm had an 8 round, loaded magazine inserted in the firearm, and one round was loaded in the chamber of the weapon. Det. Welch noted that of the nine total rounds recovered, three of them had brass casings, and five silver.

The western wall of the residence has a sliding glass door leading from the living room to an outdoor patio enclosed by a screened porch. A screen door on the northern wall of the patio leads to the back yard. As detectives exited through the door, they observed an outdoor table covered by an umbrella. On top of the table was a large bottle of Kingsford lighter fluid with its cap removed. Just west of the table was a small cylindrical charcoal grill. As detectives approached the grill, they detected the odor of burnt material, to include burnt plastic, emanating from it. Sergeant Cody opened the grill and observed what appeared to be burned clothing inside.

Mounted to the roof directly above the grill was another video surveillance camera that captured the grill and porch area.

On 08/02/2026, Det. Welch obtained a search warrant signed by Honorable Joseph LeDonne to extract surveillance footage from the DVR recovered during search of the residence. The DVR was brought to the Seminole County Sheriff's Office, where custody was transferred to Detective Blay with their Digital Forensics Unit for analysis. Detectives requested a time frame of 07/21/26 - 08/01/2026. Det. Cooper advised that he requested Det. Blay review footage on 07/28/2026, and provide that as soon as possible for detectives to review. Det. Welch was notified around 1930 hrs, stating that video footage was available for review.

On 08-02-2026, detectives reviewed the suspect's home CCTV footage. Detective G Blay with the SCSO advised Detective Cooper that some of the video's timestamps and dates would not show up, be incorrect, or be close to correct due to the fact that the DVR's power source was not collected with the system during execution of the search warrant.

Detectives observed the suspect pacing around the inside of the house that he resided in, wearing peach-colored shorts, a white shirt, and black slides, while using his cellphone. Detectives observed the suspect leave the house and arrive back at the residence riding the E-Bike seen on the multiple aforementioned surveillance videos. [REDACTED] is seen wearing the same clothing as when he left, now with the white-colored bicycle helmet. [REDACTED] is observed pushing the bike into the house via the front door and plugging in his cellphone next to the end table. [REDACTED] immediately proceeded toward the master bedroom area, where he removed the bicycle helmet from his head and placed it on the living room couch. [REDACTED] then continued toward the master bedroom, where he was observed removing his white shirt before walking out of the camera's field of view.

[REDACTED] is then seen walking out of the master bedroom, at which time he begins pacing around, jumping up and down while talking on the phone, and going into the kitchen, at which time he opens a container of milk and begins pouring it on his face in attempt to counteract the effects of being pepper sprayed. [REDACTED] then took the E-bike from the inside front door area and pushed it to the garage. The subject is observed going out of camera view again and later seen coming back into camera view, taking his clothing off.

[REDACTED] approaches the front door and allows an unidentified white female, later identified as [REDACTED] to enter. [REDACTED] was observed wearing dark-colored pants and a white tank top. Upon entering the residence, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] greeted one another with an embrace

before walking out of camera view toward [REDACTED] known bedroom.

A short time later [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] returned to the living room and kitchen area, where they appeared to be engaged in conversation. Surveillance footage then captured [REDACTED] walking into the attached garage and returning with a gray plastic grocery-style bag. [REDACTED] was observed placing the bag beneath the chaise cushion of the living room couch before returning to the kitchen area. Shortly thereafter, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] exited through the rear of the residence and walked onto the enclosed back patio together.

After [REDACTED] changes his clothing, a gold Tahoe vehicle is seen pulling into the driveway approximately an hour after [REDACTED] arrives back at the residence. The driver, and sole occupant, exits the vehicle and is observed as being approximately 6' tall, early to mid-40's, wearing a dark colored cut-off sleeve tee shirt, blue jean shorts, black slide sandals, and a chain necklace. The male is seen carrying a cell phone, and has short hair and a goatee. This male is later identified as being [REDACTED] father, Daytron Etkins. Distinguishing physical characteristics included extensive tattoos covering the majority of both arms, a tattoo extending from the back of his neck down his spine, and an additional tattoo on the right calf.

Etkins entered the residence and was greeted by [REDACTED]. Surveillance footage showed the two immediately engaging in conversation while walking throughout the residence. At one point, Etkins embraces [REDACTED] with a hug before continuing to accompany him as they moved through multiple areas of the home. Throughout their interaction, [REDACTED] continued his pattern of pacing inside the residence while speaking with Etkins. Etkins closely followed [REDACTED] during much of this time, appearing to be actively engaged in their conversation.

Similar to [REDACTED] demeanor, he appeared anxious and restless as he moved throughout the residence following [REDACTED]. On one occasion, the male sat on the living room couch, leaned back, and placed his hands against his head while staring toward the ceiling for an extended period. This activity continued for a period of time before Etkins, CS #2, and [REDACTED] exited the residence through the front door.

[REDACTED] is observed later in the video going to the backyard from the back porch while carrying a white-colored shirt and peach/salmon-colored shorts. Following [REDACTED] is Etkins as [REDACTED] lifts a circular, black-colored charcoal grill from the grass and places it near the back porch door on the small concrete patio. Once the grill was positioned, Etkins removed a cigarette from his mouth and appeared to speak to [REDACTED] immediately nodded in acknowledgment before opening a patio umbrella. The umbrella was strategically positioned in a manner that obstructed the surveillance camera's view of the grill and the area where evidence was later determined to have been intentionally burned. Etkins sits in a chair near the edge of the concrete patio, away from the grill, as [REDACTED] walks in and grabs a large white bottle with red cap from the back porch, and walking back towards the grill. [REDACTED] then sets the bottle down inside the porch, and spends several moments searching the residence, while Etkins smokes a cigarette. [REDACTED] returns, and as he approaches the grill, flames are observed quickly shooting upward, indicating that an accelerant was used to start the fire. [REDACTED] is then seen walking back into the residence along with Etkins, this time without the clothing he was seen carrying to the grill.

After the umbrella obstructed the camera's view, Etkins returned inside the residence before walking to his vehicle, where he retrieved what appeared to be a large convenience-store style beverage cup ("Big Gulp"). During Etkins's absence, [REDACTED] was observed pouring what appeared to be lighter fluid onto the area where the grill had been positioned. Investigators later recovered a container of lighter fluid from the scene. Despite preparing the area, [REDACTED] took no further action until Etkins returned.

When Etkins returned, he removed a small BIC-style lighter from his pocket and used it to light another cigarette. Moments later, while standing adjacent to the table and grill area, Etkins extended his arm out of the camera's view in the direction of [REDACTED] and the grill. Approximately ten seconds later, a sudden flash of flames erupted, indicating an accelerant was used to ignite the fire. Later in the video, [REDACTED] retrieves a small red plastic gas container from the garage, brings it outside, and is seen pouring it over the flames of the grill, causing them to rise higher.

After going back inside the residence, Etkins and [REDACTED] go to his bedroom, and exit a short time later. Etkins is seen walking into the kitchen around 2113 hrs, and is observed as he approached the kitchen countertop, he placed both hands near the right front portion of his waistband, consistent with the appendix carry position.

Detectives observed Etkins manipulating a concealed item in the area of his right appendix waistband in a manner consistent with adjusting a concealed firearm for comfort or repositioning. This type of movement is commonly associated with individuals carrying a concealed firearm in the appendix carry position.

After making the adjustment, Etkins briefly lifted his shirt, exposing what appeared to be a black semi-automatic handgun concealed in the front right portion of his waistband/underwear. The surveillance footage clearly depicts the pistol grip, magazine well, and a portion of the slide protruding above the waistband, consistent with a concealed firearm carried in the appendix position. It should be noted that these actions with the firearm take place after Etkins left the residence with [REDACTED] back to the crime scene to retrieve the firearm previously left behind.

On 08/03/2026, Det. Welch obtained an Order to Take Into Custody for [REDACTED] for two counts of second-degree murder with a firearm.

Detective Miller provided the following information, confirming Etkins's identity:

"Detective Welch informed Detective Miller that a Black male wearing a green, sleeveless shirt and blue-jean shorts arrived at [REDACTED] in a light brown Chevrolet Tahoe with dark window tint and aftermarket rims on 7/28/2026, approximately one hour after [REDACTED] arrived at the residence following the homicide. Detective Miller noted that Harris owned a 2002 Chevrolet SUV bearing Florida license plate NALW78.

Detective Miller queried the vehicle through the FLOCK database, which revealed that it had been detected several times over the past several days in the Eustis area. Detective Miller knew that [REDACTED] father, Daytron Etkins, resided in Eustis. According to FLOCK, the vehicle is described as light brown with dark window tint and large aftermarket rims.

This specific Chevrolet SUV is consistent with the Chevrolet SUV that entered the driveway of [REDACTED] on 7/28/2026, as captured by the home's surveillance system.

Detective Miller queried Florida license plate NALW78 through the FINDER application and located several police reports associated with the vehicle. On 7/5/2026, Etkins was stopped by the Groveland Police Department (case number G25070687). Etkins was identified as the driver, and Dana Long was identified as the front-seat passenger.

On 7/24/2026, a scrap report was generated at Landers Auto Recycling, located at 3024 Apopka Boulevard in Apopka. The report confirmed that Etkins was utilizing a Chevrolet SUV bearing Florida license plate NALW78.

On 8/3/2026, Task Force Officer (TFO) Cassidy was conducting static surveillance at the residence located at 1808 Bates Avenue in Eustis which is Etkins had multiple interactions at that residence.

TFO Cassidy observed Etkins at the residence for several hours throughout the day. A gold Chevrolet SUV parked at the residence matched the same gold Chevrolet SUV observed on surveillance video arriving at [REDACTED] after the homicide.

TFO Cassidy observed Etkins driving the Chevy with Florida license plate NALW78 multiple times and Etkins was the driver of the vehicle.

At one point, Eustis code enforcement drove past the house twice which was when Etkins began making evasive maneuvers and hiding behind another car in the driveway so he wasn't seen.

TFO Cassidy sent a still image of Etkins to Detective Miller, who verified that the male observed on the surveillance footage at [REDACTED] was, in fact, Etkins. Etkins has the same physical build and the same goatee as the individual observed in the surveillance footage."

On 08/04/2026, Detective Welch received notification that preliminary results from the firearm located during the search warrant did not match shell casing recovered from the crime scene.

After canvassing the neighborhood and speaking with neighbors, detectives learned that a female matching the description of the one seen on video being the first to arrive at [REDACTED] residence may reside nearby.

On 08/05/2026, detectives contacted Mother of CS #2, who was shown a photograph of the female, and confirmed it is her thirteen-year-old daughter, CS #2. The Mother agreed to bring CS #2 to the Deland Police Department for an interview. The interview was conducted in the Criminal Investigations Unit interview room which is both video and audio recorded. Prior to speaking with CS #2, as well as her mother, who remained in the room for the duration, both swore to give truthful statements.

Det. Welch advised CS #2 of the reason for her being there, and she stated that she knew it was because she was over at "his house." Det. Welch inquired who "he" was, and she initially advised the male was named "Richard." CS #2 advised that several other juveniles in her friend group introduced him to her, and that she regularly purchased marijuana and THC cartridges from him. CS #2 advised that when she first met him approximately three months ago, she found social media accounts that advised his true name was [REDACTED].

CS #2 advised that on 07/28/26, around 2000 hrs, [REDACTED] facetimed her and sounded as if he was panicking, and begging her to come over to his house. CS #2 advised that he would not say why on the phone, and that when she arrived, he quickly ushered her inside and appeared paranoid, and kept checking the front door to make sure it was locked, and the peephole to make sure no one else was there. CS #2 stated that [REDACTED] stated that he was supposed to meet someone earlier that day to sell marijuana, but that he received a phone call from either Dustin or Sam (the names she advised she saw on the news), and decided to meet and sell to them instead. CS #2 stated [REDACTED] told her he had sold to one of them before, and that he had gone to meet them behind the Athens Theatre.

Det. Welch asked CS #2 if she knew [REDACTED] to carry or own a firearm, and she stated that she did, but could only state that it was black in color. According to CS #2, [REDACTED] stated that he had the marijuana and gun in a plastic bag, and rode his e-bike to meet them. [REDACTED] told CS #2 that when he got to the area behind the old trailer, and that one of the boys

had a gun" and the other "had pepper spray." CS #2 stated that [REDACTED] went on to state that the "bigger boy" had "went behind him" and was trying to rob him and take the weed he was selling them. According to [REDACTED] the boys asked to smell the marijuana, took the marijuana out of the plastic bag to do so, leaving the firearm with [REDACTED] CS #2 stated that one of the boys also had "a pouch", referring to the sling and zipper bag Dustin was found wearing. According to [REDACTED] one of them walked behind him and tried to "spray him". CS #2 stated that he told her that one of them pointed their gun at him, and asked him "where the money was at", and continued that they allegedly told him they would "kill" him. [REDACTED] stated when they took his marijuana, he "panicked" and "grabbed his gun and shot them both."

CS #2 stated [REDACTED] told her that he "left the gun there." When asked why he did not call police and give him his version of events if he was acting in self-defense, she claimed [REDACTED] told her he did not think anyone would want to hear it because "he's black and they're white."

CS #2 stated that [REDACTED] had called his father, identified as Daytron Etkins, and provided the same version of events, and that he had "left the gun there." CS #2 stated that when Etkins arrived, it was approximately 10 minutes before the two left in his dad's vehicle to "go somewhere," and that she went home. According to CS #2, [REDACTED] told her that his dad was coming over to "take him to get the gun." CS #2 stated she was sitting on the couch for approximately 10-20 minutes while Etkins and [REDACTED] walked around and discussed the incident. CS #2 stated that she recalled [REDACTED] stating that he "panicked" and "tossed it" (the gun) over the fence." According to CS #2, Etkins and [REDACTED] kept mentioning that they needed to "go get it." CS #2 stated that she returned to [REDACTED] house later that night, and that Etkins was no longer there. CS #2 stated [REDACTED] told her that they had found the gun, but that she was not sure what they did with it, but confirmed [REDACTED] did not have possession of it.

Det. Welch reviewed the video again, and noted that the time/date stamp appeared to be one hour behind. Det. Welch observed the following:

19:34 (20:34 hrs) - [REDACTED] CS #2, and Etkins walk out the front door, and CS #2 walks north bound from the driveway and out of frame. Etkins enters the driver seat and [REDACTED] in the passenger seat and both leave traveling north on [REDACTED] towards Grantham Way.

At approximately 2050 hrs, the Tahoe is observed on a home surveillance camera traveling eastbound on W Minnesota Ave, and turning southbound on S Clara Ave towards the Athens Theatre, which is approximately .5 miles from the intersection. Notably, these roadways and the direction of travel are consistent with the route [REDACTED] was observed taking after leaving the Athens Theatre following the shooting.

Additional surveillance footage was obtained from a camera positioned at the intersection of Florida Avenue and Indiana Avenue, facing the Athens Theatre and the parking lot located immediately north of the theater. This footage captured the gold Chevrolet Tahoe traveling southbound on N. Florida Avenue at approximately 2053 hours, northbound on N. Florida Avenue at approximately 2057 hours, and southbound again on N. Florida Avenue at approximately 2109 hours. The vehicle was not observed again until it returned to the residence at approximately 2124 hours.

The surveillance evidence collected from the area is consistent with and corroborates the statement provided by CS #2, who advised Detectives that [REDACTED] and Etkins returned to the scene after leaving the residence in order to retrieve the firearm that [REDACTED] had discarded following the shooting.

Etkins exited the residence and was subsequently captured on surveillance video at approximately 2141 hours entering his vehicle. He

was observed backing out of the driveway and departing the area, traveling northbound on [REDACTED] until he was no longer visible on camera.

Using investigative databases and law enforcement resources, detectives identified Etkins' residence as 1804 Bates Avenue, Eustis, Florida. A review of Google Maps determined that the distance between [REDACTED] and 1804 Bates Avenue, Eustis, Florida, is approximately 29.2 miles.

Detectives subsequently traveled to Eustis High School – Curtright Campus, located at 1801 Bates Avenue, Eustis, Florida, to canvass the area for surveillance footage. During the canvass, detectives identified a campus surveillance camera positioned to capture Bates Avenue and the area surrounding Etkins' residence.

A review of the surveillance footage revealed that at approximately 2316 hours, the same gold Chevrolet Tahoe was observed traveling westbound on Bates Avenue. The vehicle then stopped in the roadway before reversing into the driveway of 1804 Bates Avenue.

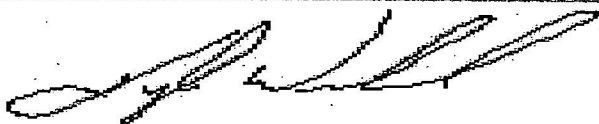
Based on the travel distance of approximately 29.2 miles and the elapsed time between Etkins' departure from [REDACTED] at approximately 2141 hours and the vehicle's arrival at 1804 Bates Avenue at approximately 2316 hours, detectives determined that the travel time is consistent with a direct route between the two locations, further corroborating that Etkins traveled directly to his residence following his departure from the [REDACTED] residence.

There is probable cause that Etkins committed the crime of Accessory After the Fact assisting [REDACTED] after he committed the crime of Second Degree Murder (Firearm), a life felony.
